Our staff of over 300 support 18 facilities in urban, suburban, and rural locations throughout Montgomery County. Our four newest branches have been built within the past four years. Members of the Executive Director's Cabinet include the Deputy Director, Director of Human Resources and Organizational Development, Chief Fiscal Officer, Director of Community Engagement and Innovation, Director of External Relations and Development, Director of Youth Services and Programming, and Director of Information Technology. Approximately 65% of staff are represented by our union, the Dayton Metro Library Staff Association.

After the 2024 passage of a second local levy, the annual budget is approximately \$56 million, more than half of which is generated by three local levies. Approximately 45% is state supported through Ohio's Public Library Fund. Private and corporate philanthropy have risen from approximately \$100,000 annually to nearly \$1.3 million within the past two years. The Friends of the Dayton Metro Library and the Dayton Metro Library Foundation provide additional philanthropic support.

New services have recently begun, which reflect the changing role of public libraries. The Main Library and branches now offer a wide range of business, non-profit and social service support including food pantries, social workers, peer recovery support specialists, records closing classes, assistance with driver's license reinstatement, non-profit support, small business support, and more. All of these new programs represent partnerships with a wide range of community organizations.

The Director of the Jersey City Free Public Library is responsible for managing New Jersey's largest municipal library with a main library, bookmobile and 9 branches in Jersey City. The Jersey City Free Public Library also supports local research collections within the New Jersey Room and is home to Biblioteca Criolla, the first and largest Spanish-language library in the State of New Jersey. The library's annual municipal budget exceeds \$13 million. Staff includes more than 140 individuals.

Some key accomplishments included:

- Secured a nearly 20% budget increase from the City of Jersey City, bringing our annual municipal allocation to \$13.3m
- Secured \$10m in funding to support an addition and restoration to the Main Library
- Completed a new strategic plan with staff and community involvement.
- Elected President, Urban Library section of the New Jersey Library Association and created the Urban Library Leaders Forum
- Appointed as member of the State Librarian Search Committee

Director, Newark Public Library

The Director of the Newark Public Library is responsible for managing the Newark public library system including the main library and seven branches. The library's annual budget is approximately \$11m. Staff FTE is approximately 130 individuals. Collections number nearly 2 million volumes.

While Newark Public Library is a public library it is also a research institution with strong special collections and extensive partnerships with Rutgers University – Newark, NJIT,

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Berkeley College and others. Some collection highlights include:

- More than 30,000 works of art on paper by artists including Warhol, Miro, Picasso, Matisse, Leger, Lichtenstein and others,
- More than 10,000 rare books and materials related to the history of print including Sumerian cuneiform tablets, Egyptian papyrus, Ethiopian scrolls and medieval manuscripts, and
- Materials related to the history of the African American, Puerto Rican and LGBTQ communities in Newark.

Some key accomplishments under my leadership include:

ADVOCACY, BUDGET AND FUND-RAISING

- Secured a \$425,000 grant from Prudential to support the development of a new strategic plan and upgrade all current public technology at the Main Library,
- Secured a \$2 million corporate (Prudential) gift, the largest in the library's history,
- Secured \$3.2 million from the city for capital improvements,
- Secured \$400,000 through a special State appropriation, requiring passage through the Senate, Assembly and Governor's office, for pre-college programming; and
- Doubled grant income from \$1.5m \$3m annually.

Washington University is one of the top 100 universities worldwide and typically ranks within the top 15 national universities in the U.S. The University Librarian (Dean equivalent) is responsible for managing all operations of the Olin libraries. Staff include 150 FTE and approximately 200 part-time student workers at 10 campus libraries. The annual budget is approximately \$25 million with additional income from nearly \$60 million in endowments.

Some key accomplishments include:

- Raised more than \$30,000,000 as part of the university's campaign, exceeding our initial goal of \$20,000,000.
- Significantly increased external support from granting agencies and foundations including the Andrew W. McMaster University is one of the top 100 universities world-wide and one of the top five universities in Canada. The University Librarian is responsible for managing all operations of the McMaster University Library and is a member of the Senior Management Team of the University, the Provost's Senior Staff, Undergraduate Council and Graduate Council.

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The McMaster University Library is comprised of three libraries including the Mills Library (Social Sciences/Humanities), the Innis Library (Business) and the Thode Library (Science/Engineering). The combined collections of the libraries total more than 2 million volumes. Staffing currently stands at more than 100 full time employees.

The University Library also includes the William Ready Division of Archives and Special Collections. The diverse collections consist of culturally significant books and unique records of national and international scope. Additions during my tenure included the Brisebois Collection on the Holocaust and Resistance, the Jackie Washington Archives, and the Pirate Group Archives (20 years of commercial advertising from one of Canada's largest and most successful advertising firms). Valued at \$3,000,000 (Canadian) the donation of the Pirate Group Archives represented the largest gift-in-kind in the library's history.

Additionally, the University Librarian at McMaster is responsible for Classroom Audio-Visual Services, a staff of 10 audio-visual specialists supporting a wide variety of learning spaces on campus. The department supports approximately 200 classrooms, lecture theaters and other non-traditional learning spaces.

In 2011 the University Libraries opened the Centre for Digital Scholarship, a \$2,000,000 (Canadian) project funded through the Lewis and Ruth Sherman Foundation to support and promote research and scholarship.

The University Libraries received the 2008 ACRL "*Excellence in Academic Libraries Award*" in recognition of its transformation and adoption of technological innovations. They were the first Canadian institution to receive the award.

The Wayne State University Library System includes the Adamany Undergraduate Library, Science and Engineering Library, Purdy/Kresge Library (humanities/social sciences), Shiffman Medical Library, and the Arthur Neef Law Library. The Library System also includes Library Computing & Media Services (providing instructional technology support to more than 300 classrooms), University Orientation, an ALA-accredited Library and Information Science Program, and Library Administrative Services.

Reporting directly to the Dean, the Associate Dean provides senior level leadership and oversight for library system operations; leads the advancement of excellence in customer service and process improvement; works with the Dean to translate the library vision and mission through development of innovative approaches to library services based on sound data and judgment and that meet the needs of customers; supports the Dean in interacting

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productively with the University administration and campus support units to advance the library system's role in advancing the urban mission of the University; assists with strategic and annual planning processes, including the formulation of system-wide and departmental goals and objectives and associated policies and procedures; leads library marketing and public relations; coordinates external programs and outreach to the urban community; provides senior level oversight to LibQUAL+ and other assessment programs; assists in defining and articulating the library system's role in teaching and learning; leads library system efforts with development of the freshman experience.

The combined staffing of these five units includes include 26 full-time librarians, IT professionals, AV Technicians and other support staff. While administratively this position falls within the University Library System organizational structure, it has campus-wide responsibility for the technology associated with more than 300 general-purpose classrooms and for approximately 1000 desktop computers in the campus' general purpose computing labs.

My responsibilities included strategic planning; coordination of project planning; prioritization and goal setting for IT related projects; analysis and report writing; purchasing and approving purchases of IT related items; development of policies, procedures, and documentation; grant-writing and administration; and evaluation of IT-related user services.
